Hi All,

It looks like an exciting month ahead in October. One of my humans is expecting a kitten (I think humans call them babies) near the start of the month. All of the other humans are very excited about meeting the new baby and are wishing Mum well. I am missing her already as she works in the office a lot and I now have to do without company when I take my snooze in the mornings.

I have asked my humans to look ahead to November and start preparing now so that I can get through the season of fireworks without getting distressed. I must admit I am not at all fond of the loud bangs around at this time of year. Thankfully, I have my humans very well trained and they know that it is most helpful to start preparing well in advance. My humans always make sure that the curtains are drawn tight so that I can't be surprised by any flashes of light. It also helps to leave a radio or television on to mask some of the noise of the fireworks. I have a feliway diffuser that is plugged in from September which releases calming pheromones into my room (you can use DAP diffusers for the same purpose if you have a dog). It also helps your pet if you provide safe hidey places for them during the firework period. If your pet chooses to use their hidey it is important to allow them to do this without interaction from you. Fussing them or talking to them can reinforce that fireworks are something to be afraid of. If you just allow your pet to hide and then go on about your normal routines then it helps your pet to realise that they need not be scared but allows them to follow their natural instinct of they do become frightened.

Better go now, I just heard one of my humans come up for her lunch break and I may be able to get an extra cuddle.
